Magnum Chorum

Recognized for expressive singing and inspired programs, Magnum Chorum brings transforming artistry and spirit to choral a cappella music. The 55-voice choir presents colorful concerts, commissions and premieres new sacred works, and provides music for worship. Founded in the choral tradition of St. Olaf College, the choir welcomes singers of all backgrounds devoted to excellence in choral music. Now concluding its 32nd season, Magnum Chorum hails from the city of Minneapolis, Minnesota, USA.

In 2018, Dr. Dwight Jilek was appointed Artistic Director of Magnum Chorum. The choir has been led by prominent Artistic Directors Jin Kim (Founding Director), David Dickau, Christopher Aspaas, and Mark Stover, and performed with distinguished guest conductors Anton Armstrong, René Clausen, Kenneth Jennings, Sigrid Johnson, Brian Schmidt, Sandra Peter, Matthew Olson, Craig Arnold, Allen Hightower, Dale Warland, and Weston Noble, and collaborated with celebrated composers Ēriks Ešenvalds,



Matthew Peterson, Stephen Paulus, Kenneth Jennings, Jake Runestad, Libby Larsen, and Ralph Johnson, and championed emerging composers Stanford Scriven, Benjamin Simmons, Scott Senko, Zachary Westermeyer, and Paul John Rudoi.

The choir has been featured at conferences of American Choral Directors Association, Chorus America, American Guild of Organists, American Hymn Society and College Music Society. In 2017, Magnum Chorum premiered the Raymond W. Brock commission with Minnesota Chorale, *Homing* by composer J.A.C. Redford, at the National ACDA Conference under the direction of Robert Spano.

Our name *Magnum Chorum* is intended to convey the importance of the choir in expressing the divine and the infinite through voice, music, and text.

Dwight earned his D.M.A. in Choral Conducting at University of North Texas

with studies in Vocal Pedagogy, where he conducted the Concert Choir and received the Outstanding Graduate Conductor award in 2016. He earned his Master's degree in Choral Conducting from Michigan State University and Bachelor of Music in Vocal Music Education from Concordia College.


